GOAL:

Bhagavad Gita is often referred to as the jewel in the crown of Hindu philosophy and religious thought. The Gita consists of 18 Chapters and 700 verses that formed the discourse given to Prince Arjuna of the Pandava dynasty by Lord Krishna on the battlefield of Kurukshetra.

"The teachings of the Gita are broad, sublime and universal. They do not belong to any particular cult, sect, creed, age, place or country. They are meant for all. They are within the reach of all. The Gita has a message for the solace, peace, freedom, salvation and perfection of all human beings."

The *Bhagavad Gita* is not just an ancient scripture but also serves as an essential guide to better living, conducting business, and communicating to the modern world. The greatest quality of *Bhagavad Gita* is that it prompts an individual to think, to make a fair and right decision, and to look at life differently and refreshingly without surrendering one's identity. The Gita has

been addressing contemporary issues and solving for everyday problems of humanity for millennia. Chief Guest of the Program Dr. Rajesh Singru, Principal TGMR focuses on Gita as a management guru.

Management is a body of knowledge that enables entities to deal with a multitude of situations involving people, process and the environment, to ensure work is done efficiently to deliver goods and services useful to the society. Good management must result in greater satisfaction for all stake holders. If we carefully study the Gita, we infer that the central issue is all about doing work (karma yoga), in the most efficient manner. Gita offers a framework for stimulating high levels of motivation. Otherwise, how can one explain the magic transformation that Arjuna has gone through from a state of fear, mental agony and hair-raising experience to one of waging a war against a battery of most credible and competent leaders in the society and eventually winning the war A careful study of Gita from this perspective will lead us to important principles that managers must inherit to create rightful and long living organizations. Such a study will help us discover certain aspects of high performing organizations. Modern organizations suffer from extreme levels of 'short termism.' Software companies in India provide what is known as quarter-on-quarter guidance. In simple terms what it means is that they inform the market players and their stakeholders what can be expected of them in the next quarter. Invariably they project a positive outcome quarter after quarter and in order to meet these guidelines they engage in a variety of activities that create stress, and a short-term oriented approach to managing business. This invariably brings negative results in the long run. In the Bhagavad Gita, Sri Krishna's first lesson to Arjuna is to train his mind to the notion of time that is essentially long term (Chapter 2, Slokas 11-13). A good understanding of this helps managers to feel less pressurized of performance targets in the short run and instead develop some conviction to engage in activities and decisions that seek to create a balance between short term and long term. Change management becomes easier as they develop comfort in the fact that people come and go and good principles and ideas must remain and drive choices in organisations.

Work and Efficiency Perhaps the most profound insight that the Bhagavad Gita offers to managers in modern corporations is the definition of work and efficiency. The definition of work presents itself as a paradoxical and often an unacceptable idea to an uninformed and casual reader of the Gita. It is important to note here that many verses in Chapter 2 and the following chapters of the Gita build2 on this central idea and therefore it requires a good understanding in its totality. It requires deep contemplation and guidance of a guru to

understand the concept. There are four aspects to the definition of work that Shri Krishna articulates: (a) The doer has the right to work (b) The doer has no control on outcomes/ fruits of action (c) The doer has,no control on the root causes of the fruits of action

(d) There is no choice to revel in inaction.

Students need of teachings of Bhagwad Gita in their life and explained about how it acts as a calming agent in all walks of life. College wants to enlighten everyone about the values and significantly asking to cultivate desired personal qualities by following the path shown in Srimad Bhagvad Gita. This digital age where attention span is dwindling and addiction to smart phones and social media is hard to fight, many would find it a laborious and grueling task to remember the entire Gita word by word and verse by verse, but those who have successfully accomplished it find the rewards are way and varied.

To inculcate the values of Bhagavad Gita in our students, Tai Golwalkar Mahavidyalaya's Swami Vivekananda Library in association with Ethical & Moral Committee celebrated Gita Jayanti on 24 December 2022.
